

TRAILBLAZERS OF EQUALITY: MANDELA, TUTU, AND NKOLI'S IMPACT ON LGBTQ+ RIGHTS IN SOUTH AFRICA

Tommy Patterson (He/Him)

CEO Cape Town Pride

Tommy has been a dedicated advocate for the LGBTI+ community for over four decades. His journey began in the 1970s in Belfast, Northern Ireland, and later took him to South Africa via Zimbabwe in 1982. At the onset of the AIDS crisis, Tommy played a pivotal role in organizing and chairing the first major LGBTI+ event in apartheid-era South Africa, known as "Shaft 8." This groundbreaking event brought together diverse groups of all colors, uniting them as one.

Tommy's activism also led to his arrest by the apartheid government for participating in a gay gathering, and he spent several days in the infamous John Voster Square Police cells. Despite these challenges, Tommy continued to work closely with Simon Nkoli, a legendary LGBTI+ activist in South Africa, and edited "Coming Out," a publication that featured the first Black gay man on the cover, a significant milestone in the country's apartheid era.

In 1999, Tommy moved to Cape Town with his partner of 43 years and owned a gay club and pub. For the last 15 years, he has served as the editor and publisher of OUT Magazine AFRICA. Tommy has also been instrumental in transforming Cape Town Pride into the most visited and spectacular month-long event on the African continent. His dedication to the LGBTI+ community remains unwavering, and he continues to inspire and empower generations to come.














WHY CAPE TOWN?


Our WorldPride Visual Identity draws inspiration from three distinct elements, each reflecting the essence of our event.




THE PROPOSED DATES FOR WORLDPRIDE CAPE TOWN 01 - 14 OCTOBER 2028.




PROPOSED TIMELINE OF EVENTS

The WorldPride Village will be host to a Pride Family Day on Saturday 7 October.





ROBBEN ISLAND

Robben Island is a significant landmark in Cape Town, as it was the home of Nelson Mandela for 18 years during the South African apartheid era. This island is now a museum and UNESCO World Heritage Site, offering tours led by ex-inmates who can provide first-hand accounts of life on the island. To celebrate the work Nelson Mandela did for the LGBTQ+ community in South Africa, a series of search lights will shine nightly through festivities, representing the LGBTQ+ flags high into the African night sky[1].





UPSCALING CAPACITY

WorldPride Cape Town 2028 will of course be substantially bigger than our usual Pride event. It is important to note that Cape Town, as a city, is reknown for producing large scale events with great success, such as FIFA World Cup and the eFormula Event.

To upscale the capacity that we usually rely on for our annual event in Cape Town, we plan to leverage additional security and safety personnel, as well as volunteers and partnerships, to manage the increased workload and ensure a well-organized and safe event. Specifically, we will:

1. Increase Security and Safety Personnel:

- Engage more trained security guards, police officers, and emergency medical personnel to provide a robust security presence and ensure the safety of all attendees
- Hire additional close protection officers and bodyguards to provide discreet and highly-trained security details for VIP attendees and high-risk individuals

2. Volunteer Recruitment:

- Recruit volunteers from various organizations and community groups to assist with tasks such as event setup, crowd management, and information dissemination
- Upskill the volunteers by training them in crowd control, emergency response, and other relevant safety protocols to ensure they can effectively support the security personnel

3. Partnerships and Coordination:

- Build on our existing partnerships with local law enforcement agencies, emergency services, and government authorities to ensure seamless coordination and the deployment of additional resources as needed
- Collaborate with the City of Cape Town's Safety and Security Directorate to leverage their expertise and resources in maintaining a safe environment for the event
- Leverage our already established relationship with the Cape Town Central City Improvement District (CCID) to benefit from their experience in managing safety and security in the city centre

4. Comprehensive Planning and Risk Assessment:

- Conduct thorough risk assessments and develop detailed security plans to identify potential threats and implement appropriate mitigation strategies
- Ensure that the close protection teams are backed by a state-of-the-art control room that can monitor the entire operation and coordinate emergency response if needed



ACCESSIBILITY TO THE EVENTS

Not only is WorldPride Cape Town 2028 for Africa - it is for EVERYONE!

The importance of making access to WorldPride Cape Town events accessible to everyone, regardless of their social status, cannot be overstated. It is crucial that the event is inclusive and welcoming to all members of the LGBTQ+ community, including those who may face financial barriers.

To ensure this, a significant portion of the tickets will be made available at reduced prices or even for free. It is estimated that around 20% of the tickets will be free, with an additional 20% being reduced in price. This will allow a broader range of people to participate and enjoy the event, regardless of their financial situation. Additionally, the event organizers will work closely with local community groups and organizations to ensure that the event is accessible and inclusive for all, including those who may face additional barriers such as disability or language barriers. By making the event accessible to everyone, WorldPride Cape Town will be a true celebration of diversity and inclusivity, reflecting the values of the LGBTQ+ community and the city of Cape Town.

South Africa's peaceful and stable transition to democracy is internationally recognised as one of the major achievements of the 20th Century.


South Africa is a young but vigorous multiparty democracy with an independent judiciary and a free and diverse press. One of the world's youngest and most progressive constitutions protects both citizens and visitors.

After decades of white minority rule Apartheid finally fell in 1994 when South Africans' remarkable ability to survive, reconcile and thrive gave rise to a "Rainbow Nation". This phrase, coined by Noble Peace Prize winner, Archbishop Emeritus Desmond Tutu, aptly describes the society that visitors to the country will meet during their time here.

ECONOMY

Ranked by the World Bank as an "upper middle-income country", South Africa was admitted to the BRICS group of emergingeconomies (Brazil, Russia, India, and China (known as BRICS) in 2010. The block promotes strategic cooperation among emerging economies and lobbies for transformation and progress in international finance, climate change, trade, and other issues of mutual importance.

A rapidly changing global economy means that emerging countries can play an increasingly prominent role on the world stage.




As a leading economy in Africa, South Africa's contribution is substantial, and as leading economic growth region in the country, the Western Cape Province is reaping the rewards of its progressive and innovative trade and investment strategies.

For those doing business in Africa – or planning to do so – South Africa's growing economy, excellent infrastructure, access to technology and support structures offers a stable base from which to operate.

Government strongly encourages foreign trade and investment with numerous publicand private sector partnerships and agencies that support business to help grow the economy. Full foreign ownership is allowed, and repatriation of profits is generous.

As one of Africa's economic powerhouses South Africa not only works to promote African interests on the global stage, but it also encourages regional economic integration on the continent and supports peace initiatives. The country belongs to several international organisations that help it to fulfil this mandate, such as the United Nations, International Monetary Fund, World Bank, G-20, and World Trade Organization



The province is investing substantially in the planning and development of major infrastructure which essential to attract and sustain investment and business in the province.

From a resource perspective, meeting the increasing demand for energy and achieving resilience in a water-scarce country has boosted the development of sustainable practices for commerce and industry to reduce water use, diversification of the regional energy mix and a proactive drive to promote renewable energy.

In the broader South African economic context, the province's approach has yielded results and it has consistently grown at a higher weighted average annual growth rate than the rest of the country for the past decade. A staggering 52% of the country's agricultural exports came from the province in 2019 and it has successfully positioned itself as the country's leading renewable energy and digital economy hub.

The Western Cape is perfectly positioned and already is fast becoming the knowledge-sharing hub for South Africa and the widercontinent. It is known for its tertiary education institutions – four world-class universities and two globally recognised business schools.

Of the top ten universities in Africa, two are based in the Western Cape - the University of Cape Town (UCT) (also number one in Africa), and the University of Stellenbosch (US). Two leading graduate schools are linked to UCT and US respectively: UCT's Graduate School of Business (UCT GSB) and Stellenbosch Business School.



Both universities have a proven track record in research and development in different fields of study.

UCT's Faculty of Health Sciences is the oldest in sub-Saharan Africa and linked to Groote Schuur Hospital where Professor Christiaan Barnard performed the first heart transplant in 1967. The school leads numerous research programmes and providesguidance to health organisations around the world.

Alongside two other tertiary institutions, University of Western Cape and the Cape Peninsula University of Technology, the provinceleads the way in tertiary education in the South Africa.

CULTURE AND PEOPLE



CapeTown's co-workingspaces, developer talent, ed tech hubs and digital skills training academies, universities, as well as ease of doing business make it a leader on the continent. 

- Visa-Free Countries: Citizens of many countries are exempt from obtaining a visa for short stays in South Africa for tourism, business, orfamily visits for up to 90 days within a 180-day period. This includes most European Union countries, the United States, Canada, Australia, and New Zealand, among others. However, it is important to check the latest information from the South African Department of HomeAffairs or the nearest South African embassy or consulate, as visa policies can change over time.
- Visa-Required Countries: Citizens of certain countries are required to obtain a visa before traveling to South Africa, regardless of thepurpose of their visit. This includes countries such as India, China, Russia, and many African countries. A visa must be obtained from a South African embassy or consulate in the traveller's home country before departure.
- Visa on Arrival: South Africa does not generally offer visa on arrival to short-term visitors. However, there are some exceptions, such as travellers from certain African countries who may be eligible for a visa on arrival for short stays.
- Requirements for Entry: In addition to obtaining a visa (if required), travellers to South Africa must have a valid passport with at leastsix months of validity remaining from the date of entry, a return or onward ticket, and proof of sufficient funds to cover their stay in SouthAfrica. They may also be required to provide evidence of accommodation arrangements, a yellow fever vaccination certificate (if traveling from or transiting through a yellow fever endemic area), and other supporting documents as requested by immigration officials.

It is important to adhere to the permitted duration of stay and not overstay the allowed period, as it may result in fines, deportation, or future travel restrictions.



These key attractions all lie within close proximity to the city centre.



CAPE POINT

The Cape of Good Hope and Cape Point form part of the Cape Peninsula National Park. A rocky promontory that juts out into the sea and was once thought to be the southern most point of Africa, Cape Point is home to 7750 hectares of indigenous flora and fauna, 150 bird species and the only shellfish-eating baboons in the world. Visitors can also travel by funicular to a viewing point to see where the Benguela and Aghulas currents converge.



CONSTANTIA WINE VALLEY

The Western Cape is a historic wine-producing region and it all started in Constantia in 1695. Featured in novels by Jane Austen and preferred by Napoleon, the wines of Constantia are legendary.



TABLE MOUNTAIN

Iconic Table Mountain was afforded National Park status in 1998. The Park offers walks, magnificent views, cable car rides in a modern cable car with revolving floor, hiking, rock climbing – even abseiling and paragliding.



V&A WATERFRONT

This unique working harbor with scenic views of Table Mountain combines high-end shopping with entertainment, fine dining, boat trips and a world-class aquarium.



KIRSTENBOSCH BOTANICAL GARDENS

Established in 1913, on the southeastern slopes of Table Mountain, the Gardens cover 528 hectares and are the best place to view the Cape Floral Kingdom; known locally as fynbos, it offers more floral diversity than the whole of Europe combined.



ROBBEN ISLAND MUSEUM

For those who followed the political history of South Africa and feel an affinity with Nobel Laureate, Nelson Mandela, a visit toRobben Island is a must. One of South Africa's 4 World Heritage Sites, Robben Island is a moving tribute to the late President Mandela's dreams of freedom.





Cape Town International Airport (CTIA) is Africa's most award- winning airport. As Africa's 3rd largest airport it processes over 8 million passengers annually with over 50 % of the country's air passengers passing through the airport. It is the primary airport serving the city of Cape Town.

Located approximately 20 kilometres (12 mi) from the city centre, the airport has domestic and international terminals, linked by a common central terminal.

The airport offers direct flights from South Africa's other two main urban areas, Johannesburg and Durban, as wellas flights to smaller centres in South Africa.

Internationally, it offers direct flights to several destinations in Africa, North America, South America, Asia and Europe and many more via Johannesburg.

Wesgro's new Air Access division is currently in negotiation with several airlines based in Africa and Europe around new routes that will make it even more convenient to travel and trade with the Western Cape.



PUBLIC TRANSPORT

MyCiTi is Cape Town's safe, reliable, convenient bus system. It is the perfect wayto connect with the city from the airport and GROUND TRAVEL to explore some of the estinations Cape Town has to offer.



WALKING

The city is ideal to explore on foot and this is the perfect way to experience the energy and vibrancy of the city.



TRAIN

Cape Town Station is situated within walking distance of most of the city centre hotels. The Metro Rail system connects the city centre with the northern suburbs, southern suburbs and Cape Flats.



CAR RENTAL

Cape Town offers a wide selection of car rental companies with good road systems. An international driver's license is required and driving is on the left hand side of the road.



CYCLING

The City of Cape Town is working to develop its bicycle infrastructure, and there are a growing number of safe cycling routes andplaces to ride in the city and surrounds as well as a number of bicycle hire shops.



TAXI OR COACH

Luxury air-conditioned coaches and shuttle buses usually transport delegates between the airport, hotels, Convention venues and the functions. Metered taxis are also available. The online travel service, Uber, is also a very popular and convenient way to travelaround Cape Town.




SCHEDULED TOURS



The Western Cape is unusually rich in diversity and offers a host of activities for visitors. Apart from sightseeing, shopping markets and high-end brands and visiting iconic World Heritage sites and beaches, the Western Cape also offers a wealth of cultural heritage, like food and wine, and is a favourite destination for adventurous activities such as rock-climbing and cycling. The largest timed cycle tour inthe world takes place here every year and there is a cycle tour between Cape Town and Knysna, on the Garden Route, for the truly adventurous.

CAPE POINT

Cape Point is the southernmost tip of the Cape Peninsula. The drive takes you via Chapmans Peak past steep mountains, secluded coves, beaches, villages and fishing communities. At Cape Point visit the Cape of Good Hope nature reserve – home of fynbos species foundnowhere else in the world and a variety of wildlife including baboons, rhebok, Cape Mountain zebra, bontebok and the elusive eland. Return via the historical Simonstown naval base.

PANORAMIC CAPE TOWN CITY TOUR

Visit the Castle, the oldest building in South Africa, then move on to another historic area of the city, the Cape Malay quarter situated on the slopes of Signal Hill. Imbibe its rich spiritual, musical and culinary heritage before diving down into the city centre itself. Drive alongAdderley Street, the lively centre of town, past the historic Groote Kerk and St. George's Cathedral, the Anglican Diocese of Nobel peace laureate Archbishop Desmond Tutu.

ROBBEN ISLAND

Famous Robben Island, whose prison was once home to former South African president Nelson Mandela as well as many other black political freedom fighters, is now a World Heritage Site and provides stunning views across the bay with Table Mountain as its backdrop. A trip to the island is an unforgettable experience and offers a glimpse into the life and times of the apartheid era. Daily tours to the island, that take approximately 31/2 hours, include the ferry trip there and back, an island tour and a tour of the prison with a former political prisoner as your guide.

TABLE MOUNTAIN

A cable car ride to the top of Table Mountain, a World Heritage Site, is a highlight of any Cape Town visit. The cableway takes you to the summit in under ten minutes whilst rotating gondola's ensure a 360 degree view of Cape Town and Table Bay. At the top stroll along 2km of pathways and enjoy magnificent views from over 12 viewing sites and decks. Facilities on the mountain include a self-service restaurant, bistro, and a shop selling gifts and curios.

WINELANDS TOUR

A visit to the Cape Winelands is an absolute must as the region is one of breathtaking vistas and majestic mountain backdrops while being steeped in rich culture and history. Rolling vineyards and quaint Cape Dutch homesteads await you, as well as award-wining wine farms offering some of the country's best wines. Within an hour's drive from the city centre, most popular and well-known regions are Stellenbosch, Franschhoek, Wellington, Paarl, The Constantia Valley, that is just a 10-minute drive from the city centre.

KIRSTENBOSCH NATIONAL BONTANICAL GARDENS

The beautiful Kirstenbosch gardens cover an area of 528 hectares with 36 hectares of cultivated garden. The gardens are a celebration of South African flora – showcasing only indigenous South African plants. Fynbos, proteas, cycads and rolling lawns are intermingled with streams and ponds and well-laid out pathways for easy walking.

Cultural Tours

A visit to one of the many townships surrounding the city is an experience that will open your eyes to the way in which the biggest portion of Cape Town's population lives. Take a township tour of Langa, the oldest township in South Africa or vibrant Khayelitsha, the second largest township in South Africa. Township tours will usually be co-led by a resident in the area, showcase local industry and community projects and include a visit to a township bar or 'shebeen'.

ADVENTURE ACTIVITIES

Cape Town, and the Western Cape, caters for the more adventurous at heart. The mountains surrounding the area provide the perfect foil for abseiling, hiking, paragliding and mountain biking while the oceans are a play ground for surfing, deep sea fishing and shark cage diving.

UNITING AFRICA

CHALLENGES FACED THROUGHOUT THE CONTINENT

Throughout Africa, individuals who identify as LGBTQ+ face significant challenges due to widespread discrimination, stigma, and legal persecution (ILGA, 2020). In many African countries, same-sex relationships are criminalized, leading to severe human rights violations and societal marginalization (ILGA, 2020). According to the International Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Trans and Intersex Association (ILGA) 2020 report, 31 out of 54 African countries criminalize consensual same-sex relationships, with penalties ranging from imprisonment to death (ILGA, 2020).



Nigeria serves as a prime example, where same-sex relationships are punishable by up to 14 years' imprisonment according to the Same-Sex Marriage (Prohibition) Act (Amnesty International, 2019). In Sudan, homosexuality is penalized by death (Amnesty International, 2019), while in Somalia, LGBTQ+ individuals confront the danger of violent persecution by extremist factions (Human Rights Watch, 2021). Countries such as Uganda and Tanzania have enacted legislation that criminalizes advocacy for LGBTQ+ rights and imposes severe penalties on those suspected of promoting homosexuality (Amnesty International, 2019).

Beyond legal persecution, LGBTQ+ individuals in Africa also grapple with pervasive social stigma and violence (Amnesty International, 2019). Amnesty International reports that LGBTQ+ people throughout the continent frequently encounter discrimination, harassment, and physical assaults, often with minimal legal recourse or protection from authorities (Amnesty International, 2019). Many are compelled to conceal their identities or abandon their homes in pursuit of safety and acceptance (Amnesty International, 2019).





UNITING AFRICA

CHALLENGES FACED THROUGHOUT THE CONTINENT

Furthermore, access to healthcare, education, and employment is often restricted for LGBTQ+ individuals in Africa due to deeply ingrained societal prejudice and discrimination (Amnesty International, 2019; Human Rights Watch, 2021). Discrimination in healthcare settings, for instance, can hinder LGBTQ+ people from obtaining essential services, including HIV prevention and treatment, thereby exacerbating health disparities and contributing to higher HIV/AIDS rates within the community (Human Rights Watch, 2021).

Despite these challenges, grassroots LGBTQ+ organizations and activists across Africa persist in their advocacy for equality, visibility, and legal reform (ILGA, 2020). Their initiatives are crucial in challenging discriminatory laws and policies, raising awareness, and providing support and resources to LGBTQ+ individuals and communities (ILGA, 2020). Nevertheless, substantial work remains to ensure that all Africans, irrespective of sexual orientation or gender identity, can reside free from discrimination and persecution (ILGA, 2020).

We begin this letter by introducing the Gender Equity Unit (GEU) at the University of the Western Cape. Established by the late Rhoda Kadalie in 1993, the GEU was founded to promote gender equality and address imbalances within our institution and beyond, especially in post-apartheid South Africa. South Africa was the first country in the world to explicitly protect against discrimination based on sexual orientation in its constitution and the fifth to legalize same-sex marriage (the first in Africa in 2006). This progressive stance did not emerge in isolation; it was the result of tireless efforts by various individuals and organizations who, alongside the broader liberation struggle of the 1970s and 1980s, ensured that LGBTIAQ+ rights were included in the mobilization against apartheid.

The creation of organizations such as Gay and Lesbians of Witwatersrand (GLOW) and the Organization of Lesbian and Gay Activists (OLGA) in 1988 by Simon Nkoli, Linda Ngobo, and Beverley Ditsie provided marginalized racial groups, including Black, Indian, and Coloured communities, with platforms to express their needs, support one another, and present a unified front against both homophobia and apartheid. Simon Nkoli also established the National Coalition for Gay and Lesbian Equality (NCGLE), later known as the Lesbian and Gay Equality Project (LGEP). These pivotal moments in our history marked a departure from the white-centered, apolitical stance of earlier gay rights groups such as the Gay Association of South Africa, aligning more closely with anti-apartheid organizations like the African National Congress (ANC) and the United Democratic Front (UDF).

We provide this historical context to highlight that our struggle for LGBTIAQ+ rights did not begin with the first Pride march in Johannesburg on 13 October 1990, which was both the first LGBTIAQ+ pride event in Africa and an anti-apartheid demonstration. Our movement, spanning over 34 years, has continuously intersected with various socio-economic issues rooted in our history. We have persistently advocated for human rights and social justice while celebrating the joys of being queer and protecting our richly diverse personal freedoms.

We strongly support the bid to bring World Pride to Cape Town. Hosting this event will showcase our rich history of fighting not only for the liberation of South Africa but also for the inclusion of LGBTIAQ+ rights within the anti-apartheid movement. It will enable us to engage globally on critical issues that still need to be addressed, both in our country and in building solidarity with African states that continue to criminalize people for their gender identity and sexuality. This event will provide a platform to reflect on what it means to enjoy personal freedoms when such freedoms are oppressed in some parts of our country and the world, and to envision what justice looks like. We believe this opportunity will unite various organizations, institutions, and movements in celebrating, organizing, and continuing the journey towards a safe and just world for all.




